## Month of November

Dear Parents,

Arriving on time (7:45 to 8:00 a.m.), enhances your child’s start to the school day. When your child arrives at the same time as other children, they observe the morning routine. The child naturally joins in, doing what comes next. For example, greeting teachers and each other. Students continue preparing their environment for learning.

During the month of November, your child will be encouraged to practice their social skills, learn to talk to one another in a polite and respectful manner during **lunch-time**.

**First Grade:** In reading, In this unit, students read and compare stories written from different points of view to understand how and why people tell stories. In Writing: students will be writing opinion and narrative stories. They will present an opinion/narrative orally using complete sentences and appropriate volume and will review the rules of standard English spelling and punctuation.

**First Grade:** In Math, during the month of November Students will be Comparing in Real-World Problems, Addition word problems, Understand True and False Equations, Finding an Unknown Number and Counting Within 120.

**First Grade:** In Science, students will Solar System, The Sun: Harmful and beneficial properties of the Sun, The Planets, The Moon and Objects in Space.

**First Grade:** In Social Studies, Students will learn about the world map, North America and National Native American Heritage Week – (Celebration of Culture and Heritage) and the First Thanksgiving.
